DIGGING DEEPER



Zechariah's Prayer

Luke 1:67-79 Pastor Alf Preaching

This is the third in a series on *Five Prayers to*Prepare for the Christ Child. Today we look at

Zechariah's Prayer in Luke 1:67-79, but there are
two passages that I talked about in the sermon that
set up the prayer: Luke 1:5-25 (Zechariah in the temple

meeting the Angel Gabriel and becoming mute because he did not believe) and Luke 1:57-66 (Zechariah and Elizabeth naming the baby at its circumcision).

1. Why is this context so important to our actual text? How do you normally, when you read Scripture individually or in a group, look for contextual clues before or after the passage you are studying?

2. I made an *observation* that "it was in God's house that God's message came to Zechariah. God shows up at the normal places where we are trying to be faithful." What are your normal ways to place yourself in the path of God's grace and direction? Do they need to change or expand?

3. My *caution* in the sermon had to do with Zechariah's unbelief—that it silenced him, caused him to be stuck, blocked him for a while. What do you think it felt like for those nine months when Zechariah was mute? Did he rationalize? How did he pray silently? Did he pray? How did he and Elizabeth relate to each other?

4. Have you ever had a time when you "blew it" with God and became stuck? There have been times in counseling when I have asked someone, "Has God told you to do something that you haven't done yet?" only to have them say back to me, "How did you know? But I'm not going to forgive her," or some other interesting response.
5. I shared a portion of the story of my call to MDPC. Share a story from your life, big or small, when you said "Yes" to God. What happened, positively or negatively?
6. Is there some invitation from God that needs your response now? This Christmas?
