- Consequences of sin




Renewing the Covenant

The Significance of Seals



There are about 60 references to seals and sealing in the Bible

- •to render something tamper-proof (Jer. 32:10, Matt. 27:66)
- •to demonstrate authority (1 Kings 21:8, John 6:27)
- to seal a letter for privacy (or not--Neh. 6-5)
- to seal a covenant (Neh. 9:38)
- to delegate authority (Esther 8:8, John 6:27)
- •to seal documents (Isa. 8:16, Rev. 5)
- •as a metaphor in the NT (Paul's reference to Abraham's circumcision as the seal of righteousness Rom.4:11)

LEVITES AND PRIESTS---What's the Difference?

- •All priests are Levites--members of the tribe of Levi who was one of the sons of Jacob.
- •All Levites are NOT priests--Priests are descendants of Aaron and his sons (Exodus 28-29)
- Priests prepared sacrifices, maintained the temple, collected tithes, presided over ritual purifications, among other things
- •Levites provided music for services, administered and taught the law to the people.

Biblical Oaths

Hebrew word for "oath" is *sheba* which means "to seven oneself"

Refers to God's covenant to Adam and Eve when he rests, blesses and makes holy the seventh day (Genesis 2:1-3)

Seven is the sacred number in Hebrew culture

Matthew 7: 3, Luke 6: 41





Modern Seals





Covenant ceremonies in the Old Testament must include swearing of oaths

- Oaths are a holy ritual
- To swear falsely profanes God's Holy Name
- God is invoked as a guarantor of the Oath
- God will punish broken or false oaths
