





# PROLOGUE: Christ-in-the-Church

# What has God done through Christ?

- Called believers into the gift of salvation. (Eph 1:3-14)
- Gave believers a magnificent hope. (1:18)
- United believers with Christ (1:20-22, 2:6)
- Reconciled believers to God through Jesus' death and victory (2:13-16)
- Called believers into one new humanity (2:15)
- Established believers as members of God's household, a new temple in the Lord (2:15, 19. 21)
- Gave believers access to the Father by the Holy Spirit (2:18)
- Bestowed believers with great privileges, certain expectations, and serious responsibilities. (4:1-16)



# Appropriate Behavior Christ-in-the-World

- Humility (meekness or kindness toward others)
- Gentleness (calmness)
- Patience
- Forbearance (self control and restraint)
- Love

# **Unity: Tower of Babel vs. The Church**



- Babel was a monument to people power.
   Church celebrates Christ's victory over death.
  - Babel was human achievement.
     Church is Christ-given. It is not about our understanding of human worth but of our sinfulness and need for forgiveness.
- Babel is monument to humankind.
   Church is Christ centered. Unity is Christ given.
  - Babel was about human pride.
     Church is about human humility.
- Babel was built by love of self.
   Church is built by love of Christ and selflessness.
  - Babel was destroyed.
     Church continues to mature.

# Chapter 3: Diversity Distribution of Different Gifts to the Various Members so that Everyone is a Contributing Part to the Unity

But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. 8 This is why it says:

"When he ascended on high, he took many captives and gave gifts to his people."

<sup>9</sup> (What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions? <sup>10</sup> He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.)

- Diversity is never at the cost of unity.
- The individual has a gifted role in the Church.
- Believers are members
   of the Messiah's body
   and take orders from
   the head and must be
   brought into line with
   what the head intends.
   The head of the Church
   is Jesus.
- Gifts mentioned were those that were needed at that particular time and is not an exhaustive list.

# **Diversity**

**Apostles** (Eye witnesses)

Prophets (Prior to the written New Testament, they were needed to speak in the name of the Lord for guiding and directing the church)

Evangelists (carry on the work of the apostles)

Pastors (shepherds and nurturers of the congregations)

**Teachers** (transmitters of the Word and encouragers of its application)

### **Purpose of the Diverse Gifts:**

- 1. Equip the members for service.
- 2. Build up the body
- 3. Maintain unity
- 4. Mature so that we are not vulnerable and we grow into Christ-likeness.

# **Chapter 4: Maturity**


We need maturity because we are vulnerable, in need of protection and stability. We need to recognize and resist deceitful teaching. We need to grow toward perfection.



- Infants (We need a childlike heart to grow, but we do not need childishness. Christianity is not a religion only for children.)
- Boats tossed in a windy sea
- Prey to cunning charlatans or false teachers or Satan



Jesus gave us an example of how we are to live and what we are to look like. We should grow in Christ in every way (faith, knowledge, unity, and love). The more we become like Christ, the more we are incorporated into him. Christ is not only the goal, but the source of growth because Jesus supplies the unity, nourishment, and the progress.
