







What does it mean to wait?

- 1. To remain inactive. (I wait for the bus.)
- 2. To be available. (My email waits for me.)
- 3. To remain neglected. (The matter can wait until later.)
- 4. To postpone. (The vacation has to wait.)
- 5. To delay gratification. (I wait to get ice cream.)

- 6. To serve. (I wait tables at a café.)
- 7. To be ready. (I *wait* for the coming of the Lord.)

Second Coming of Jesus Three Words Used in the New Testament

- 1. Someone has arrived; an invading army is here; the king is here in a province of his kingdom.
- 2. The appearance of a deity to his worshippers; the accession of an emperor to power.
- 3. An unveiling

The Second Coming of Jesus is the arrival of the king; and it is God appearing and mounting the throne; and it is Jesus unveiling to the world the full blaze of his heavenly glory!
