The resurrection of Jesus was

- A divine act involving all three persons of the Trinity
- Renewing of His body into a glorified and deathless body
- An historical event

THE MEANING OF THE RESURRECTION

- **demonstrated Jesus' victory over death**
- **vindicated Him as righteous**
- **confirmed His divine identity**

- led to His ascension and heavenly reign
- guarantees the believer's present forgiveness and justification
- is the believer's hope of eternal life in Him
