

The Oath

A solemn usually formal calling upon God to witness to the truth of what one says or to witness that one sincerely intends to do what one says. A solemn attestation of the truth or inviolability of one's words.

"Are you the king of the Jews?" asked Pilate. "You have said so," Jesus replied. The chief priests accused him of many things. So again Pilate asked "Aren't you going to answer? See how many things they are accusing you of." But Jesus still made no reply, and Pilate was amazed.

No Scar? by Amy Carmichael


"Have you no scar? No hidden scar on foot or side or hand?

The Investiture

The Sovereign first being dressed in a series of ornate robes, including a stole, holds the Scepter/Rod (symbolic of justice and mercy). Finally the Crown is placed on the Sovereign's head and is acclaimed with loud and repeated shouts.


'He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.'

When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly."



The Homage


Respect and reverence is given first by the Lords
Spiritual (the bishops) and then by the Lords Temporal (secular Lords) and the commons.


The View From The Cross Itself
