What is an Apocalypse?

- A literary genre which takes its name for the Greek word "apokalypsis" which means "revelation" or "unveiling"
- Apocalyptic literature emphasizes the lifting of the veil between heaven and earth and the revelation of God's plan for the world
- Distinctive features include: predictions of future events, visionary experiences, journeys to heaven and vivid symbolism

The Function of Symbolism


Adds double levels of meaning

 Conveys complex ideas with single word or phrase









Real Love is a Personal Exchange

If you take away the cross you don't have a God of love.

All life-changing love toward people with serious needs is a substitutional sacrifice.

How can God be a God of love if he does not become personally involved in suffering the same violence, oppression, pain and weakness that we experience?

Real Forgiveness is Costly Suffering

Real forgiveness means bearing the cost rather than making the wrongdoer do it.

Everyone who forgives someone, bears the other's sins.

Jesus Christ is God, so God did not inflict pain on someone else but on the cross absorbed the pain, violence and evil of the world into Himself.

When He tells us to love our enemies, He gives, along with the command, the love itself.
